The Healthy Relationship Project Overview

Our curriculum is based, in part, on the Prevent Child Abuse Vermont program. It is founded on 4 key concepts:

1. Adults are primarily responsible for protecting children and adolescents from abuse.
2. Violence can be prevented through skill-based, developmentally targeted health promotion with students in the classroom.
3. Comprehensive prevention includes victim and victimizer prevention and bystander engagement.
4. Consideration of the impact of trauma and past victimization is critical when engaging in sexual abuse prevention.

Care for Kids

Care for Kids is an early childhood sexual abuse prevention curriculum for pre-k through 2nd grade.

Topics include:

- communication skills
- nurturing skills (empathy)
- understanding healthy boundaries



We Care Elementary

We Care Elementary is a curriculum for students in grades 3-6. Each grade level includes 6 lessons that focus on various topics related to healthy relationships.

Topics include:

- communication
- understanding feelings
- personal boundaries —recognizing others' boundaries
- understanding sexual harassment

Safe-T Program

The Sexual Abuse Free Environment for Teens (SAFE-T) Program, is a curriculum designed for 7th and 8th grade students. SAFE-T includes up to 10 lessons in each grade.

Topics Include:

- coping skills
- bystander intervention
- empathy building
- uncovering gender stereotypes



We offer two different programs for high school students:

Healthy & Controlling Relationships

Topics include:

- recognizing abusive and controlling dating behaviors
- defining qualities of healthy relationships
- barriers to ending abusive relationships
- helping a friend

Sexual Violence & Consent

Topics include:

- defining consent
- understanding sexual violence
- bystander intervention
